

Findings of the Terrorist Trial Report Card Update, Sept. 11, 2006 - Jan. 1, 2008

DOJ Follows Consistent Pattern in Terrorism Prosecutions: Increasingly Predictable Results Going Forward

- Two-thirds of "terrorists" since 9/11 have never been charged with terrorism.
- The conviction rate for terrorism is virtually unchanged since September 2006.
- The conviction rate for terrorism is lower than all reported felonies except civil rights offenses.
- Most people publicly accused of terrorism are either American citizens or their citizenship is unknown.
- There is no way to tell how often the government uses secret information in prosecuting suspected terrorists.
- Unlike other crimes, the government does not publish comprehensive terrorism prosecution statistics.
